In 1969, a group of German-Canadians in Victoria had a dream—to create an environment which celebrates German culture in Victoria. The rest, they say, is history. Membership fees 41 years ago amounted to \$24.00 per year. Those early members helped build this facility through fundraising activities and hard work. The monthly newsletter, *Das Echo* was born & evolved to this bi-monthly edition. Affiliated support groups were formed and continue to this day. The Harmony Choir; the Victoria Accordion Club, and the Edelweiss Dancers—all are important aspects of what we do and how we share our culture with the community. The common bond between all our support groups is membership in the Victoria Edelweiss Club.

Our non-profit society was incorporated in March 1970; and our constitution was updated in 2004. The constitution is an important document that all members should have. It is currently posted on our website ; and hard copies will be available at the AGM in April.

So why am I telling you this? Because we (your elected Board) are now working toward our future—to sustain this non-profit society and ensure it is still here for future generations. We are committed to the Vision and Mission stated in our constitution, and we are working hard to create a sustainable, long term plan that we will share with you at the AGM. We are excited about what the future holds, and hope you are too.

On to the AGM. Our Board currently consists of 8 members. We could really use new Board members, to provide some workload relief to existing Board members and also

provide new expertise onto the Board. We are specifically looking for the following:

- **Hausmeister:** the role of Hausmeister is to provide guidance and leadership to our Caretaker; authorize the work that is to be performed in the facility, and generally take charge and report out on the state of the building.
- **Das Echo:** the role of the producer of *Das Echo* is to typeset (and write) articles for the bi-monthly newsletter, and to e-mail and mail it to members. A template has already been created (in Microsoft Publisher); and the membership lists are provided by the Membership Secretary.
- **Membership Secretary:** the Membership Secretary looks after the membership listing, updates, receives payment for membership (to pass on to the Treasurer) and ensures members receive their annual cards. In past times, the Membership Secretary has also published *Das Echo*.
- **Board Secretary:** takes minutes of our meetings, deals with correspondence (and responds to same); and keeps our office and records in order.

You may be interested in one of these (or other) roles, but not be interested in being on the Board. We understand that, and hope it doesn't stop you from volunteering! We have come to the agreement that not all these roles require a presence at the Board table—however, you must be willing to report out on your activities to another Board member for the monthly meetings.

The Board Secretary is required to be at the Board table. If you are interested in any of the other roles, I encourage you to contact me as soon as possible so we can consider your interest before the Annual General Meeting (April 6th).

Spring is coming, the flowers are starting to bloom—and we have a lot of things planned for this year. We hope you'll come out to the AGM (remember—only paid up members are eligible to vote!) and provide constructive support to the future of our organization. 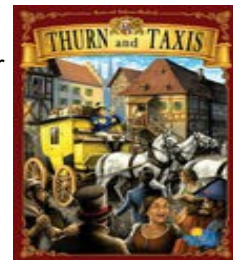

### Recipe of the Month: **Grandma's Polish Perogies** (from [www.allrecipes.com](http://www.allrecipes.com) (Canada))

A "great big hello!" to our multicultural members! This month's recipe is from Poland... "guten appetit" to my brother-in-law Bamm Bamm Garost.

#### Ingredients:

- 4 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 2 tablespoons butter, melted
- 2 cups sour cream
- 2 eggs
- 1 egg yolk
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 8 baking potatoes, peeled and cubed
- 1 cup shredded Cheddar cheese
- onion salt to taste (optional)
- salt and pepper to taste

#### Directions

1. In a large bowl, stir together the flour and salt. In a separate bowl, whisk together the butter, sour cream, eggs, egg yolk and oil. Stir the wet ingredients into the flour until well blended. Cover the bowl with a towel, and let stand for 15 to 20 minutes.
2. Make mashed potatoes & mash with shredded cheese while still hot. Season with onion salt, salt and pepper. Set aside to cool.
3. Separate the perogie dough into two balls. Roll out one piece at a time on a lightly floured surface until it is thin enough to work with, but not too thin so that it tears. Cut into circles using a cookie cutter, perogie cutter,

or a glass. Brush a little water around the edges of the circles, and spoon some filling into the center. Fold the circles over into half-circles, and press to seal the edges. To save perogies for another day: place perogies on a cookie sheet, and freeze. Once frozen, transfer to freezer storage bags or containers.

4. To cook perogies: Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to a boil. Drop perogies in one at a time. They are done when they float to the top. Do not boil too long, or they will be soggy! Remove with a slotted spoon.
