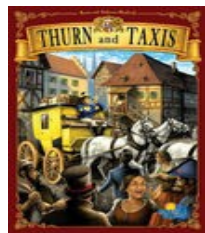

Recipe of the Month: Baked Spinach with Cheese (<http://www.inmamaskitchen.com>)

Traditional German Christmas Menu:

- roast goose with wild rice stuffing
- german potato dumplings
- brussels sprouts in beer
- baked spinach with cheese
- caramel turnips
- mushrooms in cream sauce
- fennel gratin with citrus crust
- mashed potatoes
- saute red cabbage with apple
- stollen
- mulled wine

Baked Spinach with Cheese (Uberbackener Spinat Mit Kase)

- 1 1/2 pounds fresh spinach
- 5 tablespoons butter
- 1 large onion, diced
- 2 garlic cloves, minced

- Salt to taste
- 1/4 pound Emmenthaler cheese, grated
- 1 teaspoon paprika
- 1/8 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper

Wash and drain spinach. Dry well. Cut spinach lengthwise into wide strips. Set aside. In a large Dutch oven heat butter until it begins to foam.

Stir in onion and garlic. Sauté for 2-3 minutes. A

Add the spinach. Season with salt. Cover and steam just until spinach begins to wilt.

Remove from heat.

Lightly butter an ovenproof casserole. Cover casserole with spinach. Sprinkle with paprika, nutmeg and pepper.

Top with grated cheese.

Bake in preheated 350° F oven 15 - 20 minutes or until cheese bubbles.

Der **Dezember** bringt uns unsere geliebte und traute **Weihnachtsfeier am 13. 12. 2011 um 14:00 Uhr im Chorzimmer im obersten Stockwerk**, mit Weihnachtsgedichten, -geschichten und -liedern sowie Gebaeck und anderen Leckerbissen der Saison.

Wir sind immer noch bei den Österreichern, und zwar stammt die folgende kleine Weihnachtsgeschichte von Karl Heinrich Wagerl (1897 - 1973) aus seinen Kindheitserinnerungen.

"Kurz vor dem Fest, sinnigerweise am Tag des ungläubigen Thomas, musste der Wunschzettel für das Christkind geschrieben werden, ohne Kleckse und Fehler, versteht sich, und mit Farben sauber ausgemalt. Zuoberst verzeichnete ich anstandshalber, was ja ohnehin von selber eintraf, die Pudelhaube oder jene Art von Wollstrümpfen,

die so entsetzlich bissen, als ob sie mit Ameisen gefüllt wären. Darunter aber schrieb ich Jahr für Jahr mit hoffnungsloser Geduld den kühnsten meiner Träume, den Anker-Steinbaukasten, ein Wunderwerk nach allem, was ich davon gehört hatte. Ich glaube ja heute noch, daß sogar die Architekten der Jahrhundertwende ihre Eingebungen von dorthier bezogen haben.

Aber ich selber bekam ihn ja nie, wahrscheinlich wegen der ungemein sorgfältigen Buchhaltung im Himmel, die alles genau verzeichnete, gestohlene Zuckerstücke und zerbrochene Fensterscheiben und ähnliche Missetaten, die sich durch ein paar Tage auffälliger Frömmigkeit vor Weihnachten auch nicht mehr abgelten ließen.

Wenn mein Wunschzettel endlich fertig vor dem Fenster lag, mußte ich aus brüderlicher Liebe auch noch den für meine Schwester schreiben. Ungemein zungenfertig plapperte sie von einer Schlafpuppe, einem Kramladen - lauter albernes Zeug. Da und dort schrieb ich wohl ein heimliches "Muß nicht sein" dazu, aber vergeblich. Am Heiligen Abend konnte sie doch eine Menge von Früchten ihrer Unverschämtheit ernten.

Der Vater, als Haupt und Ernährer unserer Familie, brauchte natürlich keinen Wunschzettel zu liefern. Für ihn dachte sich die Mutter in jedem Jahr etwas Besonderes aus. Ich erinnere mich noch an ein Sitzkissen, das sie ihm einmal bescherte, ein Wunderwerk aus bemaltem Samt mit einer Goldschnur eingefaßt. Er besaunte es auch sehr und lobte es überschwänglich, aber eine Weile später schob er es doch heimlich wieder zur Seite. Offenbar wagte es nicht einmal er, auf einem röhrenden Hirschen zu sitzen, mitten im Hochgebirge.

Vor dem Heiligen Abend kam noch eine letzte Prüfung, das Bad in der Küche. Das fing ganz harmlos an. Ich saß im Zuber wie ein gebrühtes

Schweinchen und plätscherte verächtlich mit dem Wasser, in der Hoffnung, daß ich nun doch schon groß genug sei, um der Schande des Gewaschenwerdens zu entgehen. Aber plötzlich fiel die Mutter wieder mit der Reisbürste über mich her.

Es half nichts, kein Gezeter und Gespreize. Erst in der äußersten Not erbarmte sich der Vater und nahm ein bis zur Unkenntlichkeit entstelltes, ein durchscheinendes Geschöpf in seine Arme. Und da war sie nun wirklich, die stillste Zeit im Jahr, wirklich Stille und Friede, und köstliche Geborgenheit an seiner breiten Brust."
